## **COLONOSCOPY INSTRUCTIONS SHEET/MIRALAX - SPLIT DOSE**

	schedule your colonoscopy or if you have any questions about your procedure, call Dr. rbagiovanni's office at (217) 222-6550, option #1, extension 3636.
	ur appointment for your colonoscopy is at the Blessing Surgery Center, 00 Spring Street.
TIME: Blessing Hospital Prep Clinic staff will call you with the tentative time of arrival approximately 3-5 days prior to your procedure. Blessing Hospital Prep Clinic is open 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If you need to cancel the day of the procedure, call the GI Center at (217) 277-3505. <b>DO NOT CALL THIS NUMBER TO SCHEDULE THE APPOINTMENT</b> .	
1.	Be on a clear-liquid diet all day Clear liquids are anything you can pour into a glass and see through. Liquids allowed are: coffee (black), tea, water, clear fruit juices (grape, apple, cranberry), bouillon, jello, soda, popsicles and Gatorade. <b>(NO RED COLORING).</b> No solid food, milk or milk products including non-dairy creamers. No food with seeds or corn 3 days prior to procedure.
2.	You will need to purchase 2 Dulcolax (bisacodyl) laxative pills and 1 bottle of MiraLax (238 gm), this is over-the-counter in the laxative section. You will also need 64 ounces of Gatorade.
3.	Take the 2 Dulcolax (bisacodyl) pills at 3 p.m. on Mix the whole container of MiraLax with 64 ounces of Gatorade. Start drinking the mix at 4 p.m. Drink one 8-ounce glass every 15-20 minutes until half of the solution (32 ounces) is gone.
	On the day of the procedure, at 6 a.m., start drinking the other half of the solution (32 ounces) until gone.
	<b>WHAT TO EXPECT:</b> After 3 hours of drinking prep, stools should be watery and you should be able to see through toilet water. If not, call Physician Exchange at (217) 222-2088.
4.	You may continue with clear liquids until 4 hours prior to the procedure.
5.	Since you will have a mild sedative after you arrive at the GI Center, you must be accompanied by someone who can drive you home after your procedure.
6.	You must <i>DISCONTINUE</i> the following medications 7 days prior to your procedure: aspirin, Motrin, ibuprofen, Nuprin, Advil, Aleve, any type of arthritis medication, nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDS), iron supplements, vitamins that contain iron, Aggrenox, any blood-thinning medications such as Plavix or Ticlid, and all herbal supplements.
7.	Discontinue Coumadin 3 days prior.
8.	Please be sure to take any heart or blood pressure medications with sips of water the morning of procedure.
9.	You may take Tylenol products or Celebrex.

**IF YOU ARE DIABETIC**: The day prior to the procedure you may take your oral medication. If on insulin, take only  $\frac{1}{2}$  dose of insulin. Do not take oral diabetic medications on the day of the procedure. Only take  $\frac{1}{2}$  dose of insulin the morning of the procedure. If taking Byetta, Januvia or Victoza, hold day before
