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POST-OPERATIVE INSTRUCTIONS - SEPTOPLASTY

Pain Control

- Recommend Tylenol (over-the-counter) and Ibuprofen (over-the-counter)
- <u>Tylenol</u> dosing for adults is 650 mg every 4 hours (or 975 mg every 6 hours). **Do not exceed** 4,000 mg of Acetaminophen (Tylenol) in a 24-hour period.
- <u>Ibuprofen</u> dosing for adults is 600 mg every 6 hours. **Do not exceed 3,200 mg of Ibuprofen in a 24-hour period.**
- If you have problems with liver or kidneys, please talk to Dr. Sheffield or your primary care provider about adjusting dosages.
- Oxycodone tablets (5 mg) have been prescribed for pain that is not adequately covered by
 Tylenol or Ibuprofen. Take 1 tablet every 4-6 hours as needed. Be aware that this narcotic pain
 medication can make you drowsy, and you should not drive while taking it.
- <u>Docusate</u> is a stool softener which has been prescribed for use while taking narcotic pain medication to avoid constipation.

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•	has been prescribed to decrease risk of post-op infections. Please take as
	directed. Recommend eating yogurt daily while on an antibiotic to help avoid GI upset.

Nasal Care

- The drip pad under your nose is in place to catch any bleeding. You may remove at any time. Replace it if needed for bleeding/drainage. Expect to have some bloody discharge for the first several days after surgery. If there is continuous oozing of blood from the nose, you may purchase some <u>nasal decongestant spray</u> (Afrin or similar; active ingredient is <u>Oxymetazoline</u>) and use it in each nostril for 2 hours. **Do not use it more than the first 3 days after surgery.** If you have a lot of blood coming out that is not stopping, please call Dr. Sheffield or go to the ER for further evaluation.
- Use <u>nasal saline spray</u> (1-2 sprays in each nostril) **every hour while awake** to minimize nasal crusting and promote healing

Activity

- Advance as tolerated. Most every day activities are fine. Avoid doing things that would increase
 pressure in your head because this could lead to nosebleed. Avoid heavy lifting (>25 lbs) or
 straining until after follow up with Dr. Sheffield in 1 week. You may return to work or school
 whenever pain is controlled, and you feel up to it.
- No nose blowing for 2 weeks.
- Sneeze with mouth open for 2 weeks.

Diet

 Advance as tolerated to general diet. Start slowly because you may have some nausea associated with general anesthesia.

Follow up in 5-7 days with Dr. Sheffield for examination and nasal stent removal.
